CLASS PARTICIPATION/ATTENDANCE:

Students will be expected to read assigned materials and be prepared to participate in class discussions. In accordance with school policy, a student whose absences exceed twenty (20) percent of the total number of classes will be barred from taking the final examination and in such instance will receive the grade of "F" in the course. Given the complexity of the Immigration Act, students are not expected to concentrate heavily on the statutes unless otherwise informed in advance in class.

GRADING:

Your final grade will be comprised of in-class work/participation and a final examination. The final examination will be open book; students may use all course materials and personal notes as well as outlines. The final exam will comprise ninety (90) percent of your final grade. Your level of class participation comprise ten (10) percent of your final grade and will be used to adjust your grade upward or downward, for example from a B to a B+ or conversely from a B to a B-.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a two credit course on Business Immigration. This class is designed to provide you with a practical understanding of the employment-based immigration system in the United States. In this regard, the class will focus very heavily on administrative decisions and administrative case law. We will examine nonimmigrant and immigrant visas, changes and adjustments in status, issues concerning artists and students, and immigration compliance as well as the constitutional issues surrounding immigration enforcement. Our class will also focus on the immigration-related hurdles that employers face. We will discuss current issues and controversies as well as the political and public policy factors in an evolving context which are shaping the reform of U.S. immigration law. The purpose of this course is to give each student a working knowledge of employment-based immigration and workplace compliance laws and issues. It will cover corporate and individual practice, immigration litigation, immigration enforcement/compliance and consular practice.
